



MATHEMATICS

- Read, write, order and compare numbers to at least 1 000 000
- Rounding to nearest 10, 100, 1000, 10000 and 100000
- Rounding to estimate calculations
- Formal methods for addition and subtraction
- Problem and reasoning addition and subtraction
- Negative numbers
- Reading and interpreting graphs and charts.



ENGLISH

- **Friend or Foe** – the children will be reading and studying the book 'Friend or Foe' by Michael Morpurgo and then writing their own evacuation story.
- **SPaG** – relative clauses, subordinate clauses, figurative language and direct speech

TOPIC Battle of Britain

- **Science** – properties and changes of materials. Compare and group together everyday materials on the basis of their properties, separate mixtures, irreversible and reversible changes.
- **Computing** – we are architects. Using the program 'Sketch up' to draw 3D images.
- **History** – The Battle of Britain. We will look at why the war started, evacuation, life on the home front, the role of propaganda and VE day.
- **PE** – **cross country running** – learning to pace themselves, comparing and improving personal times. **Netball** – learning different ways of passing, moving into space and dodging leading to learning High 5 positions.
- **RE** - How do Christians know God? How do they worship God?
- **PSHCE** – Learn how to collaborate, compromise, be a good friend and be more aware of emotional needs.
- **Art** – learn how to show the effect of light on objects, produce propaganda posters

WAYS YOU CAN HELP AT HOME

- Practise spellings weekly in spelling booklet. Copy each word 5 times into the book. Then do further practise using the 'look, cover, write, check' method.
- Use spelling shed, click on word lists for that week.
- Listen to your child read regularly and ask detailed questions about the books read at home.
- Encourage your child to practise their times tables and number facts on a weekly basis including TT Rockstars. Other websites for maths activities 'Mathsframe' - many games/activities are free and 'Hit the Button' website.
- Weekly Maths Challenges will be sent home.
- Optional research about World War Two- PowerPoint or model to show what they have researched.
