Monday – Read Chapter 4 and 5 of Victorian Venture and answer the associated guided reading questions.

(This link is to be used in the next 3 lessons.)

Watch video 1 then complete the PDF 'Subordinating conjunctions Jigsaw 1' As a challenge, rewrite the jigsaw sentences by moving the conjunction to the start of sentence. For example: **After the tornado hit the village, the cold wind blew violently.**

Wednesday - Read about story settings and watch the video. Complete activity 1 and 2. Activity 2 is also included as a PDF, 'The Classroom'.

Thursday - Read the setting description (Activity 2) again. Use this great example to help you to write a setting description for the Victorian streets of York which Charlie and Tilda find themselves in during Chapter 3. Use any further chapters you have read to add to your description. Make good use of the tips given in the bbc bitesize link.

Friday – Read Chapter 6 of Victorian Venture and the associated guided reading questions.

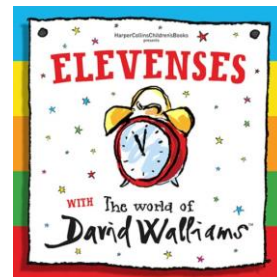
Also continue to use Spelling Shed on a daily basis.


HISTORY
