ENGLISH

History Hackers Victorian Venture.

The whole book was included as a PDF in week 1. For each chapter, there are guided reading questions to answer. Again, the whole booklet has previously been included as a PDF. Below is a suggested way of organising the week's learning. For the next couple of weeks, we will read only 2 chapters each week.

Monday - Read Chapter 10 and answer the guided reading questions.

Tuesday – Follow this link <https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/articles/zkcd7sg>. This should take you to a bbc bitesize lesson about relative clauses. The children have learned about these before but this is an important Y5 objective so is revisited throughout the year. Watch the videos and complete activities 1 and 2.

Wednesday – Following on from yesterday, complete activity 3. There is a long list of activities. Please **do not** do all of them. We suggest that you just complete 'Cheeseburgers 1 and 2'. They do not need printing off. The answers and a useful guide to terminology are at the end of the document.

Thursday – Complete 'Tilda's workhouse diary'. Try to use relative clauses in your writing. For example, Agatha Crowle, **who thinks she's in charge**, bosses me and Alice around. My workhouse uniform, **which is very itchy**, consists of a grey, shapeless shift dress and a once-white apron.

Friday - Read Chapter 11 and answer the guided reading questions.

Also continue to use Spelling Shed on a daily basis.

In addition to the above, it is important that your child:

- reads an age appropriate book daily - at least 20 minutes
- practises their times tables daily
- practises their spellings – see Spelling Shed (The next 2 weeks spelling are set and will be added to accordingly)

HISTORY
