

1. Click on the set of lessons for your year group.
2. The lessons follow through progressively so they need to be done in order from the first lesson in order to build up understanding of the concepts.
Week Beginning: 27-4-20. Start with Week 2 Lesson 1 – 'Recognise a third'. We have briefly covered this in class so this should build nicely upon what you already know.
3. Watch the video.
4. Find a calm space where you can work for about 20-30 minutes. The activities can be printed off or you can just answer them on paper or even just discuss the answers.
5. Use the video guidance to help you as you work through a lesson.

Topic (Mexico)

Geography: Can you use the map (below) and Google Maps to track how you would get from Mirfield to Tocuaro (a small village in Mexico)? If you have a printer, print off the map and draw a line to show how you would make the journey. If you are unable to print it just discuss it. Try to use geographical language (North, South, East and West) when planning your route. For example, "I would travel west over Ireland, then head south over the North Atlantic Ocean..."



Art: In Mexico, there is a very important celebration called 'The Day of the Dead' you may have seen a film called 'Coco' which is all about the festival. During their celebrations, Mexican people create and wear colourful masks. Please research some designs and then design your own using the attached template. Remember, colour and pattern are very important.
