Task 2: Wanted Poster. Imagine you've woken up to find that the bad pirate has stolen your treasure. Design a wanted poster to try and catch them. Use the template or draw your own.

Task 3: Write your own pirate story. Use the story mountain to help guide you through a beginning, middle and ending. Try to include the following:

- Super sentence starters (e.g. The next day/Suddenly/In the blink of an eye)
- Expanded noun phrases (e.g. The *deep, blue sea* was crashing against the side of the *dull, wooden ship*'.

You could then type this up and email it for us to read.

Times Tables Rockstars: Ten minutes a day on here can make a real difference. It is also beneficial to simply write the times tables down as this helps to notice the patterns in each (e.g.  $0 \times 2 = 0$ ,  $1 \times 2 = 2$  etc.)
