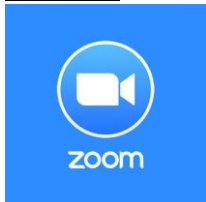


Year 3 – W/C 15thth June 2020

Remember to: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• add detail to your sentences by using and or but;• add explanation to your sentences using because;• use fronted adverbials like After that or because, to start some sentences;• check your capital letters at the start of sentences, full stops at the end and commas after a fronted adverbial or the phrase introduced by the fronted adverbial.
Thursday	Continue to write your log.
Friday	Complete one or both of the 60 second reads (sent by PDF) There is an extra sheet that explains each type of questions <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Building the pyramids• Cars of the future

- **Spelling:** Choose an activity from the Spelling Menu each day; complete this in addition to the English tasks. Use the Twinkl link to access the PowerPoint for the new spelling pattern. (PDF sent separately)
- **Spelling Frame Website:** Spelling frame also have the spellings patterns alongside a wide variety of games for children. No login needed- select year 3 and 4 spellings to find the correct list: **Spelling Rule 9**

Note: Within school, we do not teach from Spelling Frame. However, the selection of activities is great as it includes dictation sentences and selecting the correct spellings from a list, which often helps children to recognise their own mistakes.

- log on to Numbots,
- practise the 4 formal methods using the PDF we attached last week, it is also on the school website

TT ROCKSTARS

10 games on garage.

You could use the 'Rockslam' section for a change. This means you can 'challenge' another player from Year 3. Go to the 'ROCKSLAM' tab, choose a player to challenge by clicking on their name. Then click 'start challenge match'. You don't need to be online at the same time as the person you are challenging. They will be able to see that they have been challenged when they next log in. There will be a red circle with a number in to show how many 'Rockslams' you have been challenged to. You could even challenge one of the **Year 3** teachers! (Please don't challenge any other teachers)

❖ NUMBOTS

Although Numbots starts very easy, over time it really will improve your child's mental arithmetic ability. We'd like them to play on it for 5 or 10 minutes a day, by doing this you will also see they become quicker at completing calculations for the 4 formal methods. You can access it through TT Rockstars, click 'story,' see how many coins you can earn so you can buy new parts for your robot, you could send us a picture of your robot so we can see what it looks like. We can see from our Stats some children are making super progress – so well done to you!

Vocabulary

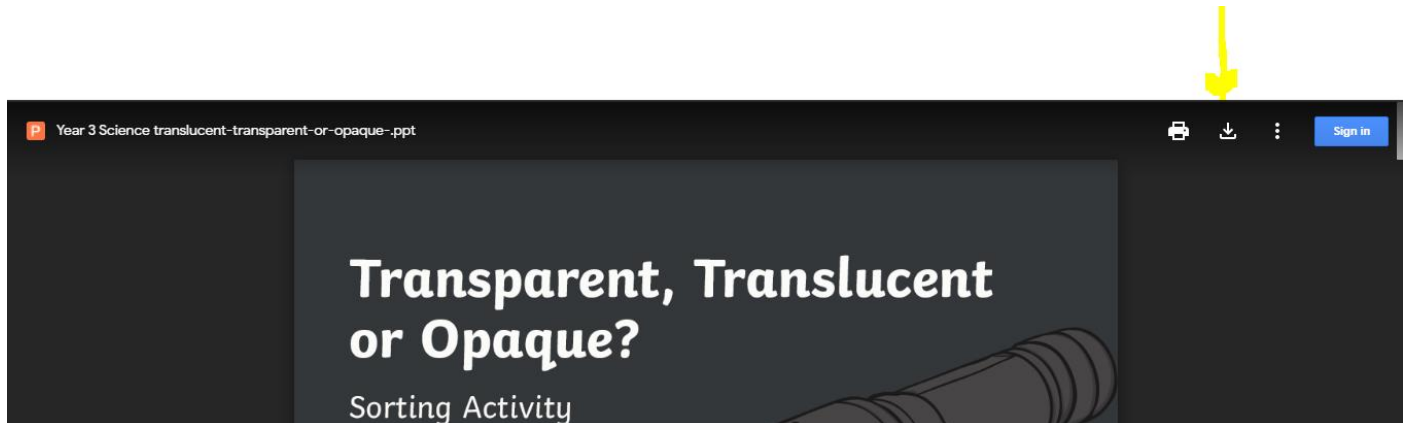
Atlas	Book of maps
Capital city	The city where the government sits
City	A large town
Climate	Weather that is typical of that place
Continent	A large area of land that consists of countries
Compass points	Any of the main points of a compass: N, S, E, W, NE, NW, SE and SW
Country	An area of land that is controlled by its own government
Equator	An imaginary line around the middle of the Earth at an equal distance from North and South pole
Island	A piece of land completely surrounded by water
Human features	Features of the land that have been affected by humans
Humid	A climate that is very hot and damp
Oceans	One of five large areas of salt water on the Earth's surface
Physical features	Natural features of land
Population	All the people who live in a country
Temperature	A measure of how hot or cold a place is
Tectonic	Relating to the structure of the Earth's surface or crust (Covered when we looked at volcanoes)
Sea	A large area of water that is part of an ocean
Vegetation	Plants, trees and flowers

ART

This half term, we are focusing on **Flowers.**

A famous artist, Vincent Van Gogh produced 'Sunflowers' which we will look at to model our final piece on.

Task for this week: Research Van Gogh and his famous piece 'Sunflowers' create a mood board of ideas, information, facts. (see example below)

More art: If you want to challenge yourself, you could attempt to draw a snippet of 'Sunflowers.'

Create a 7cm square tile and cover over a section of the painting. Imitate this drawing on a larger scale, enlarge the 7cm section to A5. You could use colour and shading to add detail to your work. Use any materials you have access to: watercolours, charcoal, pencils, pastels, sharpie pens.

Remember how we set out our work in our sketchbooks. You are free to be creative and experiment with presentation. Here is a good example. It contains some images, some text, colour and some drawing practice.

In addition, it is important that your child:

- Reads an age appropriate book daily - at least 20 minutes.
- Practices their phonics – phase 4, 5 tricky words and year 2 and 3 common exception words.
- Exercises regularly – <https://app.gonoodle.com/> Gonoodle is an excellent free website (you have to sign up for a free account) that provides videos for exercise. We use this regularly in Year 3 – your child will have their favourites! They could even create their own ‘Gonoodle’ to a favourite song! Joe Wicks is also doing a PE fitness session at 9am Mon-Fri via his channel on YouTube – The Body Coach TV.
- Practises handwriting weekly – they could write out their spellings or a favourite poem or song
