



MATHEMATICS

- **Money**- recognise and use symbols for £ and pence and combine amounts to make a value. Find different combinations of coins for different amounts and solve simple problems involving money.
- **Multiplication & Division**- recall and use multiplication facts 2, 5 and 10 times tables. Calculate mathematical statements for multiplication and division and write them using the appropriate symbols. Solve simple problems involving multiplication and division. Show that multiplication can be done in any order (commutative) and that division cannot.



TOPIC

The Great Fire of London

- **Computing** –To learn to use Dazzle and to create a picture of a scene from The Great Fire of London. Children will then use 'Publisher' to write a simple newspaper report about The Great Fire of London, using their Dazzle picture as their newspaper picture.
- **History** –The children will be learning about Guy Fawkes and finding out about The Gunpowder Plot. They will also study and explore how and where The Great Fire of London started and the reasons for the spread of the fire.
- **Music** – Long and Short. The children will compose firework music and understand how to read and perform graphic scores.
- **PE** – Dance – Toys
- **RE**- Why does Christmas matter to Christians?
- **Art** – The children will create a group collage of a scene from The

- **Firework Poetry** – *The children will read, respond to and write poems with particular patterns.*
- **Information Texts** - *The children will learn about the key features of a non-fiction text and then write a newspaper article about The Great Fire of London.*
- **Eyewitness account** – the children will imagine they were at The Great Fire of London and will write an eyewitness account.



WAYS YOU CAN HELP AT HOME

- Listen to your child on a regular basis.
- Read and discuss lots of different text types to your child. - fiction, non-fiction and poetry.
